Ordinance No. 98

**Hunting
Orion Oaks County Park**

Adopted August 19, 1991

AN ORDINANCE ENACTED TO PROVIDE AREA CLOSURES TO HUNTING WITH FIREARMS AND DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS WITHIN THE CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF ORION, OAKLAND COUNTY; TO PROTECT THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY AND WELFARE; TO PROMOTE SAFETY IN HUNTING ACTIVITIES; AND TO PROVIDE PENALTIES TO AUTHORITY GRANTED UNDER ACT 159, PUBLIC ACTS OF 1967, BEING MICHIGAN COMPILED LAWS ANNOTATED 317.331, ET. SEQ.

Section 1 - Title and Construction

- A. This Ordinance shall be known as the "Hunting Area Control Ordinance", and it shall be deemed sufficient, in any action for the enforcement hereof, to define the same by short title, and by reference to the number hereof.
- B. The terms of this Ordinance shall be construed in accord with the terms of Act 159, of the Public Acts of 1967, being MCLA 317.331, *et. seq.*

Section 2 - Acts Prohibited

It shall be unlawful to hunt with a firearm or to discharge a firearm in the following described areas of the Charter Township of Orion, Oakland County, State of Michigan, being Town 4 North, Range 10 East:

That portion of Sections 16, 17, 20, and 21 west of Joslyn Road, south of Clarkston Road, east of Baldwin Road and north of Lessiter Drive, Cedar Key Drive, and Scripps Road.

Section 3 - Repeal

All other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 4 - Penalty

Any person committing a violation of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof before a court of competent jurisdiction, shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) and costs of prosecution, by imprisonment in the County Jail not to exceed ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the Court.

Section 5 - Saving Clause

If any section or provision of this Ordinance shall be held void, ineffective, or unconstitutional, the remainder of this Ordinance shall remain effective.

Section 6 - Effective Date

This Ordinance shall take effect upon publication in The Lake Orion Review newspaper, as provided by law.
